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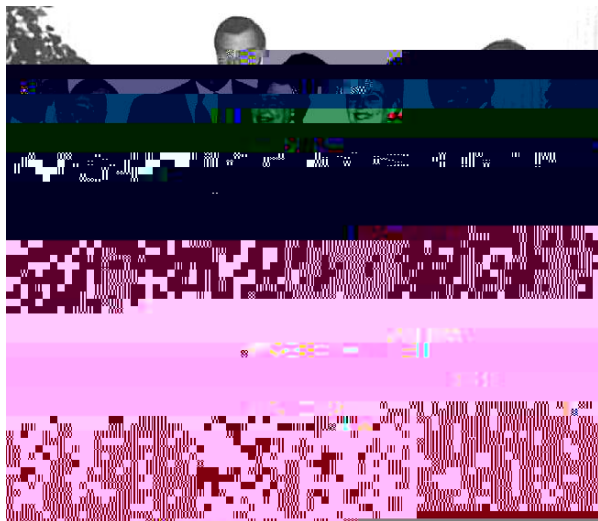

Dr. Denny Clawson is the recipient of the **PSCA High School Counselor of the Year Award for 2001**. Currently Dr. Clawson is Guidance Chair for Hempfield School District. He received his M.Ed. in School Counseling from IUP and was the first person to receive his Doctoral degree from the Counselor Education Department. He is a member of the Department Advisory Board and is an Internship Supervisor for school counseling students. Dr. Clawson also has been an adjunct faculty member with IUP, California University of PA, and Duquesne University.

Sandra Goldfarb (M.Ed., IUP) is the Elementary School Counselor of the Year. She has been a counselor since 1985 at Arrowhead Elementary School in Methacton School District, Collegeville, PA. Sandra was named Montgomery County Counselor of the Year in 1997, has served on the PSCA Executive Board since 1991 and is the PSCA conference chairperson for the 2002 conference.
