Provost Timothy Moerland confirmed the organizational changes are effective June 1, 2021, and academic changes start the fall semester.

The following motion was approved by the IUP Council of Trustees:

THAT THE COUNCIL OF TRUSTEES APPROVE THE IUP-APSCUF REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL ACTIONS WHICH WERE APPROVED AT THE FEBRUARY, MARCH, AND APRIL MEETINGS OF THE IUP-APSCUF REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL AND THE FEBRUARY, MARCH, AND APRIL MEETINGS OF UNIVERSITY SENATE AND SUBSEQUENTLY APPROVED BY PRESIDENT DRISCOLL.

Provost Moerland provided a brief update on the curriculum items approved by the IUP -APSCUF Representative Council, which included four new certificates, two new minors, three new specializations, and one new track. He noted that five policies were revised and approved at Senate, including a temporary modification to the Pass -Fail policy.

Provost Moerland also provided updates on four areas within Academic Affairs. The first was cybersecurity, as there were a number of cyberattacks on higher education institutions in March and April. Two of those cyberattacks included newsworthy instances at State System institutions. He called for consistent vigilance.

The second area involved proposed college and department names. Dr. Moerland discussed several proposals for new or revised names for colleges and departments. These proposed changes reflect reorganizations and mergers that are

required by the State System. The first of these is the proposed name change for the Department of Business Administration to the College of Business Administration. The second is the proposed name change for the Department of Education to the College of Education. The third is the proposed name change for the Department of Health, Behavior, and Society to the College of Health, Behavior, and Society. The fourth is the proposed name change for the Department of Psychology to the College of Psychology.

Finally, the provost gave a progress report on IUP NextGen planning and implementation. He noted that planning has progressed to the second set of previously identified priorities. He also discussed how the University College will be structurally and functionally configured in IUP NextGen.

REPORT OF THE STUDENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

Abigaëlle Vertil, chair of the Student Affairs Committee, presented the following report:

The Student Affairs Committee met today with Vice President for Student Affairs Tom Segar.

Dr. Segar gave opening remarks about the Student Affairs Division.

The director of the Department for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, Dr. [Name], presented a report on the progress of the DEI initiative. She discussed the various programs and services that are in place to support students from diverse backgrounds and cultures. She also discussed the challenges that remain and the steps that are being taken to address them.

Athletics Director Todd Garzarelli provided an update on the IUP Athletics spring 2021 season and plans for 2021 -22. He reported that there are three Athletics resolutions to be presented at the public meeting.

WHEREAS, Miss Leonard served the institution for nearly 50 years, outlasting all others who reported for work in 1875, and shaped the character of the university seen today;

WHEREAS, Charles Cashdollar is an IUP Distinguished Alumni Award recipient, Distinguished University Professor, and professor emeritus of history;

WHEREAS, Dr. Cashdollar was the founding director of the Liberal Studies program at IUP and chair of the committee that led to the establishment of the Cook Honors College;

WHEREAS, Dr. Bharathan has completed more than 20,000 tests for COVID -19 and has solidified his commitment to conduct research, develop new protocols, and use innovative technologies, increasing the speed of testing in underserved areas in the United States and around the world;

WHEREAS, Dr. Bharathan has demonstrated that the resources, talent, and people necessary to fight a global pandemic exist in small communities, and that with collaboration, dedication, commitment, and expertise, citizens can effectively fight an invisible enemy;

WHEREAS, Dr. Bharathan has served IUP since 1997 by investing his time in students and fellow faculty and by leveraging external partnerships, serving as the catalyst behind recent collaborations and future opportunities with IRMC;
