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International Education and Engagement

Education as a comprehensive, one

Timothy Moerland, provost and vice president for Academic Affairs, reported that the name change for the college of education is something that better reflects the mission and composition of the college. Provost Moerland highlighted the Senate actions, specifically that there were 107 curriculum revisions over the three-month period, demonstrating that IUP is constantly revising its curriculum and is not static. Dr. Moerland called out two items in particular. The first is the new PhD in Business program. This was a significant undertaking and a noteworthy advance to prepare academics for teaching within colleges of business. The second was the new bachelor's in environmental engineering. This program is interdisciplinary in nature and is the second of the specific programs identified within the strategic plan that has been achieved. Both programs are slated for Board of Governors consideration in July 2017.

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Michele Petrucci, associate vice president for International Education and Global Engagement and the executive director of the American Language Institute, provided a comprehensive overview of international education and engagement. IUP has the singular distinction in the State System in both the quality and the quantity of the programs it provides related to international education. IUP has more international students than the other 13 universities combined—52 percent study here at IUP. IUP takes great pride in this, as programs and interactions contribute to both international and American students' educational experiences. Dr. Petrucci highlighted the role of the Office of International
