**Third Step:** Make sure the word **DRAFT** is in yellow at the top of the proposal

**Fourth Step:** Click on “**EDIT CONTENTS**” (*not EDIT*) and start completing the template. When exiting or when done, click “**SAVE**” (*not Save Draft*) on bottom right

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|  | <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. ART 525 Critical Practice is deleted as an elective. Our accreditation body, National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD) requires 50% of all courses to be graduate-only. If students elect to take ART 525 Critical Practice, total coursework would comprise 40% graduate-only. The degree would be out of compliance with accreditation standards. In the current curriculum, student must choose between two courses, ART 525 or ART 680. Students will now be required to enroll in ART 680 Graduate Studio Critique.</li><li>2.</li></ol> |

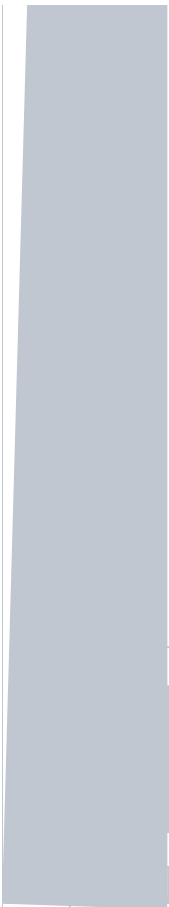

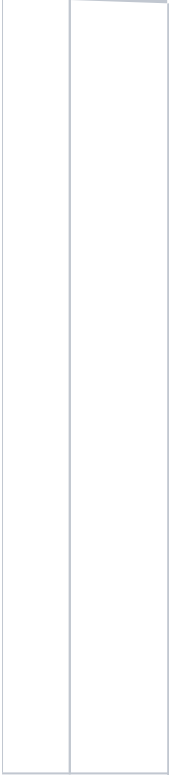
