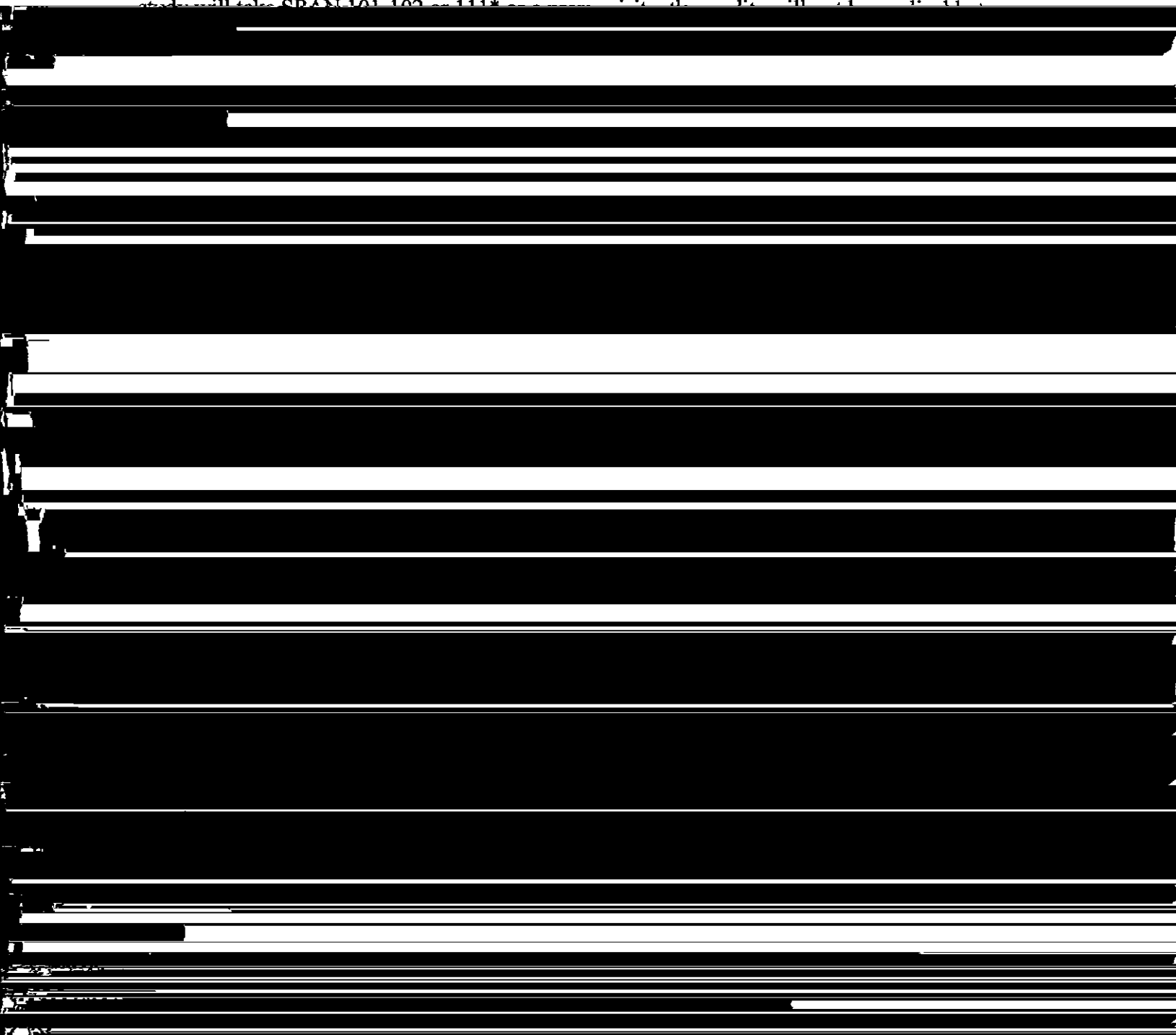

College Language Requirements

Students in the College of Humanities and Social Sciences, who must pass an intermediate-level language course requirement for graduation, may choose any one of the languages offered by the Department of Foreign Languages (Chinese, French, German, Japanese, Spanish) or any of the Critical Languages. Those choosing the Spanish option will fulfill the requirement by successfully completing SPAN 201 or 211.* The student with no previous foreign language
