

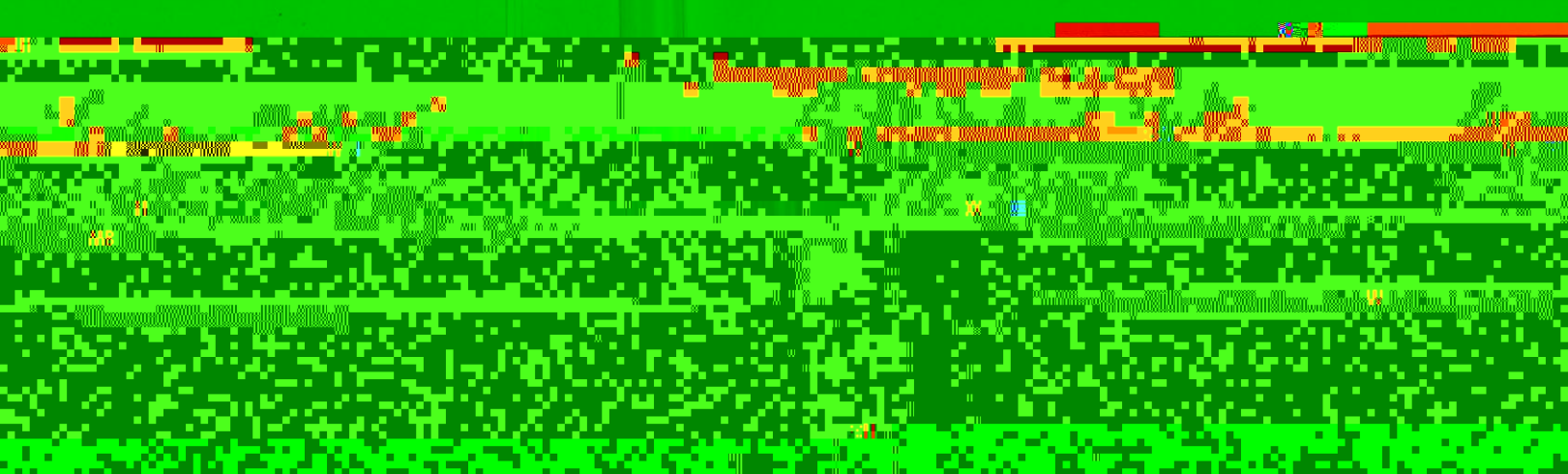

Course Number	Course Title	Description
101	Introduction to Psychology	This course provides a general overview of the field of psychology, including the scientific method, major theories, and applications in various settings.
