



	3. Justification:
	Changing the title of the course brings the course in line with the new degree title and the new Pennsylvania Department of Education certification requirements. The PDE split social science education into two certifications, Citizenship Education and Social Science Education. Since our program prepares students for Citizenship Education, we wanted to avoid confusing our program with the Social Science certification program. Consequently, we changed the title of the degree from Secondary Social Science
